





















12. LONG-TERM: Facilitate low-income Community Solar and research the potential of including this option as part of a lower tier in the Acton Power Choice program.



7. LONG-TERM: Start a yearly Porchfest Concert Series for West Acton.



Comments From "C" Graders (1/6)

- This town has never seen a proposal it didn't like. Money, apparently, is no object. Taxes just keep going up. Do we really need a new DPW building? Probably not, but we have a proposal, so lets do it. After Kelly's corner, I give up.
- That's all they came up with?? I'm underwhelmed.

Comments From "C" Graders (2/6)

 There is a website called Clear.gov that tracks town spending and breaks it down per category using pie charts that would provide the majority of transparency tax payers expect to see from their town officials. Many towns in the commonwealth use clear.gov already and Acton used to use it up until around 2020 when it stopped using it. Also, Deepseek, ChatGPT can quickly and concisely put together announcements on plans, upcoming projects etc any existing employee can simply manage communications in minutes using these tools

Comments From "C" Graders (3/6)

- Seems to me there must be more important items such as staff retention.
- Answer in detail as to how you were able to send me an email? How do i make you responsible of my feelings here?
- We need to stop spending over 2 1/2 and encourage more restaurants and business in town to off set taxes. We can't keep paying this much.
- Get rid of the DEI staff positions in both the Town and Schools.

Comments From "C" Graders (4/6)

- The key items are too low on priority list.
- We spend too much on things that don't matter.
 I'd prefer projects that would move wires under
 ground, town sewer, allow drive through options
 for businesses, increase sidewalks to get
 pedestrians out of the road, etc

Comments From "C" Graders (5/6)

 Being a solar and EV user/consumer myself, I know the generation benefits that Mass solar infrastructure vs other states produces for an ROI. This is a horrible use of community time and funding. The return is calculably low. Solar in New England should be a consumer driven option. If I want to spend my money on my own tree hugging desires, it's my money to throw at it. More than half the year in NE, solar is not producing daily effective output to warrant the spend. (answer continues on next slide)

Comments From "C" Graders (6/6)

 Public Art - Let other private led groups who have this passion drive this imitative I don't see this as a goal the vast majority of the community would be aggressively interested in pursuing. I feel that any Town Select objectives should have 66% of the community behind them.

Comments From "D" Graders (1/5)

- The BoS should focus on services everyone expects when they pay local taxes — required infrastructure & public safety. Things like a porch fest and public art are nice, but seems like things that don't require any BoS involvement. And stop pushing the progressive agenda (green and DEI). It's expensive and divisive.
- Improve and add sidewalks!!!!

Comments From "D" Graders (2/5)

- Continuing to waste money and honor supporting the anti democratic DEI should have been a question. Imagine hiring a DEIO who, when asked "What is equity?" responds "It is being equitable."
- A looming expense that is technically outside of the town budget is "what to do with the Conant building now that enrollment is down." No need to come up with a bunch of other ways to spend money while we have that looming over our tax bill.

Comments From "D" Graders (3/5)

- We cook with gas. Don't waste money on replacing gas pipes
- The town of Acton spends way too much money beyond its revenue and keeps increasing taxes on the residents...this town is becoming a socialist town and unlivable!

Comments From "D" Graders (4/5)

• We should eliminate anything that is absolutely optional (like ART PROJECTS) and/or put other projects on hold until we can actually BALANCE A BUDGET....without overrides. We also should NOT levy a tax for storm water repair on the tax bills by using a "different fund." You are just skirting overrides and it lowers any type of confidence in the town managing anything.

Comments From "D" Graders (5/5)

- We know the difference between WANTS and NEEDS. My spouse and I WANT central air conditioning, but our window AC units work fine, so we don't NEED central air. The Select Board MUST focus its spending priorities on NEEDS, not WANTS.
